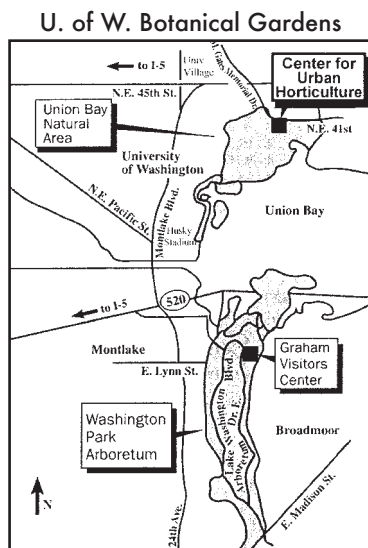

Cass Turnbull's 2007 Master Pruner Seminar Series Sponsored by Fanno Saws

Join Cass and other experts for this 18-part series of in-depth pruning slideshows. Along with hands-on workshops, the Master Pruner seminars constitute a complete pruning course. Classes are good for ISA and Master Gardener continuing education credits. **Take one class—or take them all.**

Sunday, Sept 9, 2007: How to Prune and Renovate the Overgrown Garden. This is the primary class of the Master Pruner courses. It covers basic pruning of ornamental trees and shrubs, as well as creative solutions to the overgrown or over-planted garden. Learn the types of pruning cuts and consider the concept of the “pruning budget”. Plants are divided into three categories according to their natural habits and pruning techniques are given for each. See lots of before and after slides. Diagrams will illustrate pruning for size reduction and for definition (thinning).

Sunday, October 14, 2007: Five Easy Plants to Prune. This two-hour slideshow covers basic cuts, basic plant habits, and what Cass Turnbull calls the “pruning budget”. We’ll discuss five plants that are relatively easy to prune: nandina, evergreen azalea, lilac, camellia and yew.

Sunday, November 11, 2007: Trees I – guest instructor is Bess Bronstein, Horticulture faculty at Edmonds Community College. This is a two-hour slideshow on tree pruning (not including fruit or nut trees). We’ll cover how to prune a tree limb, plus branch collar identification and the basics of compartmentalization. Also discussed: early training of trees, included bark, double leaders, ANSI tree pruning standards, crown cleaning, crown raising, utility line clearance pruning, mature tree pruning.
